

Keynote Baris EfeFounder of Vali – Entrepreneurship Hub at ESMT Berlin

Baris is the founder of Vali – Entrepreneurship Hub at ESMT Berlin, which he launched during his studies to open new opportunities for founders, innovators, and ecosystem partners. Vali aims to build the #1 unicorn founded by an ESMT alumni and strengthen entrepreneurship at ESMT by connecting startups, corporates, SMEs, and investors through programs and other formats.
